Bulletin Reflection

In today's second reading, St. Paul provides a wonderful one-sentence summary of Christian stewardship: "Out of love, place yourselves at one another's service."

Living Stewardship

We are grateful this week for all stewards in our parish who choose small acts of giving, be it driving an elderly neighbor to the doctor, helping out at the church's festival or giving a hug to someone, just because!

Stewardship – "How much do I have to give???"

Frequently, in discussions of stewardship (or "sacrificial giving"), reference will be made to "the biblical tithe" (giving 10 percent of income) and other norms that could provide helpful guidelines for generous giving. As disciples of Jesus, each of us has a responsibility to support the Church and to contribute generously to the building up of the Body of Christ. The emphasis in the bishops' pastoral, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, is not on "tithing" (giving a fixed percent of income), but on giving according to our means. In many ways this is a far more challenging norm. It challenges us to be good stewards not only in how much we give away, but in what we do with all our resources.

Action Item:

Share something/anything with someone who is less fortunate.

St. Ann Parish Pastoral Council: Did you know...?

The idea of St. Ann Catholic Parish began in 1984 as two homemakers prayed and talked about the possibility of getting together with other Catholics in town. From that humble beginning, our parish moved from a little white clapboard church in downtown Coppell, to the middle school, to the dedication of a parish building in 1989, and finally to our current wonderful church, dedicated on October 28th, 2001.

Our church is a basilica in a Spanish mission design, continuing the design of our original parish structure. The church is striking inside and outside. The beautiful copper domes are painted and will stay that color. They will not oxidize to green. The Austrian pine that once stood atop the dome is now planted on the west side, near the chapel.

Representatives from Centex Construction, the builders, said they always place a tree at the top of buildings to remind themselves that 'God's creation always supercedes man's creation'.

The towers contain bells over 100 years old, three small ones in the west tower and one large one in the east. The bells ring at noon and 6, as well as 10 minutes before each Mass.

The 22,000 square foot courtyard has become the center of many events. The beautiful three-tiered cast iron fountain is 10 foot high and 10 feet across. The hospitality area is in the southwest corner. Across the courtyard are the nursery co-op and several classrooms. 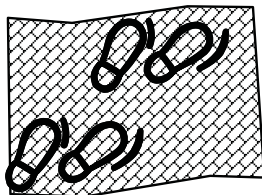

**Rite of Christian Initiation
of Adults (RCIA)**



Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is the process by which both unbaptized adults and those
 baptized in other faiths become Catholic. It is a spiritual formation process, beginning each year in
 September, and culminating with entry into the Catholic Church at Easter time as the candidate re-
 ceives the sacraments of initiation: Baptism (if not previously baptized in another Christian denomina-
 tion), Confirmation, and the Eucharist. RCIA classes are held on Sunday mornings, starting at 9:15am
 and last approximately one and one-half hours. The RCIA process is comprised of three phases.

* The Period of Inquiry is a ten-week phase consisting of lectures on key topics pertaining to Catho-
 lic doctrine, including Church Authority, Church History, Salvation and Grace, Mary and the Saints,
 Prayer and the Rosary, the Liturgy, and the Sacraments.

* The Period of Catechumenate begins on the First Sunday of Advent, and extends through Ash
 Wednesday.

* The Period of Purification and Enlightenment, which extends from Ash Wednesday through the
 Easter Vigil and Mystagogy.

Registration is now underway for the next RCIA Class that begins September 12, 2010
