Stewardship – Putting our faith into action!

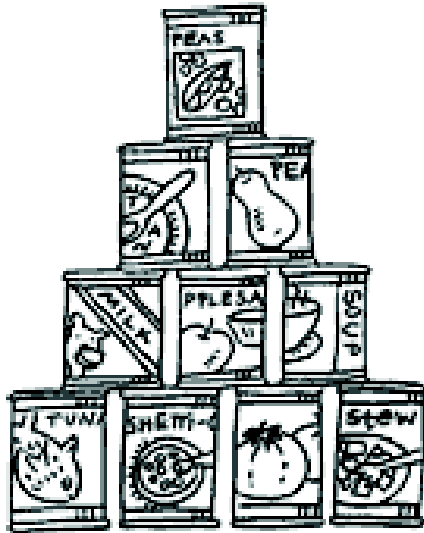
At its heart, stewardship is an expression of what we believe. We believe in "The Lord, the giver of life" - that our infinite God is the source of infinite abundance. The more that we try to claim what God has given as our own, the less we receive. It's like trying to clutch water in your fist. The tighter you clench, the less water you can carry. It's only when you relax your grasp and open your palm that you create a cup.

Often, when we hear the word Stewardship, we think it will involve increasing financial contributions, spending more time at worthwhile service activities, or visiting the sick in the hospital. It's true that stewardship requires giving, but giving can also mean consciously making ourselves available to our family during conversation at dinner, reading and praying over Church documents, or resolving to use your work day to its fullest.

Action Item: *Start this week with one small step and make a 'choice' to acknowledge our dependence on God for all we have and all we are. After all, stewardship is really how we live our lives on a daily basis as a result of professing our belief in the message of the Gospel.*
